Our **Decisions Program** provides each participant with a mechanism to empower a sense of ownership by connecting their heart and core spirit with their mind to identify and compose core values which are authentic. Engaging in this exercise in self-identity produces a platform of self-awareness which is likely to lead to higher quality decisions and success in life.

We are continuing to penetrate the **Vermont secondary school system** although our progress has been impacted by issues associated with the Covid-19 pandemic. Our primary initiative involves turning our core values challenge and Decisions Program into digital curriculum which will be housed on our website. Although we are making progress, there is still work to be done before we can launch it and have it reflect well on the foundation. Much of our focus and energy has been devoted to this project over the course of the last five or six months. It is our belief that curriculum tutorials will significantly extend the opportunities for us to expand our outreach.

Our **Adventure Scholarship Program** continues to attract high quality applicants. We've made about 120 awards over the six-year existence of this program. Our intern, Everett Tillett, has done an excellent job reaching out to the awardees and stimulating them to share with us what is happening in their lives.

The Flyin Ryan crew is in good shape. Christine Golden of Golden Consulting LLC handles administrative and operational affairs. She continues to do a superb job and provides us with a solid operational platform to execute responsibilities and opportunities. Annie Martin, our intern last year, is coordinating our social media outreach. David Punia continues to help us with our IT issues and has been instrumental in creating content for the curriculum apps which we are developing for the website. Sparky Millikin serves as our bookkeeper. Robert Miller is our pro bono attorney who weighs in as needed. I am incredibly grateful for their service and commitment to our mission.
